## **CHURCH ACTIVITIES**

Happy Easter to all of our readers! This article speaks to the history, customs and traditions, which we celebrate at Easter.

Easter and the Holidays that are related to it are moveable feasts, in that they do not fall on a fixed date in the Gregorian or Julian Calendars (which follow the motion of the sun and the seasons). Instead they are based on a Lunar Calendar similar – but not identical – to the Hebrew Calendar.

Some examples:

<b>Years</b>	<b>Western Christianity March-22 to April-25</b>	<b>Eastern Christianity April-4 to May-8</b>
2006	April 16	April 23
2007	April 8	April 8
2009	April 12	April 19
2010	April 4	April 4
2011	April 24	April 24
2012	April 8	April 15

You will notice that certain Easter Celebrations have the same date.

There are many Easter Customs and traditions. Only a few are listed as follows:

Easter Parade	Dyeing and decorating eggs
Easter Bonnet	Egg Rolling on the lawns
Easter Cards	Easter Egg Hunt
Easter Rabbit	Chocolate Easter Bunnies
Easter Eggs	Chocolate Easter Eggs
Marshmallow Bunnies	Peeps
Jelly Beans	Egg picking (egg butting) ask your Mom or Dad about this

During Lent the use of eggs was forbidden. On Easter Sunday eggs were brought to the table colored red to symbolize Easter Joy. The egg is an emblem of germination of life in the early spring.

The Easter rabbit lays the eggs, for which reason they are hidden in the nest (Easter Basket). The rabbit has always been the emblem of fertility.
