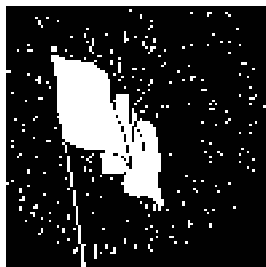

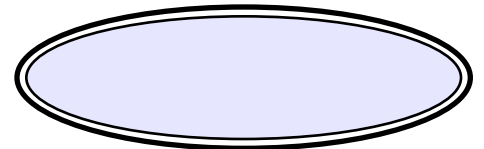

Vatican's UN Ambassador Presents Award to Supreme Knight

Archbishop Celestino Migliore, the Holy See's Permanent Observer at the United Nations, presented the Servitor Pacis (Servant of Peace) Award to Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson on June 12. Also honored was the President of the sixty-first session of the United Nations, Sheikha Haya Rashed Al Khalifa, who received the Path to Peace Award.

State Deputies Gather in New Haven for Semiannual Meeting

Both new and returning State Deputies from throughout the Order gathered for the semiannual State Deputies Meeting in New Haven June 6-10. General business sessions, breakout work groups and special events fill the four-day gathering and prepare the top leadership of the Order for the new fraternal year.

Knights Set New Record for Charitable Giving

The Knights of Columbus announced June 8 that it set new records for charitable giving and volunteer service in 2006. The Order's annual Survey of Fraternal Activity showed that total 2006 contributions to charity at all levels reached \$143,816,004, up by more than \$4 million from 2005.

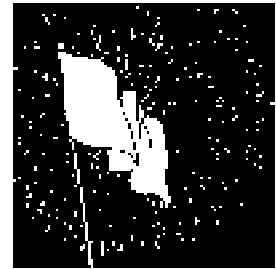
