On February 28, 55 members of the US House of Representatives signed a "Catholic Statement of Principles." They claim to be "committed to . . . protecting the most vulnerable among us." That is why Pope John Paul II, in *Christifideles Laici*, declared, 'Above all, the common outcry, which is justly made on behalf of human rights — for example, the right to health, to home, to work, to family, to culture — is false and illusory if the right to life, the most basic and fundamental right and the condition for all other personal rights, is not defended with maximum determination' (n. 38). That is also why the United States Bishops wrote in 1998: "The failure to protect and defend life in its most vulnerable stages renders suspect any claims to the 'rightness' of positions in other matters" (*Living the Gospel of Life*, n.23).

To all Catholics in public office who want to be committed to protecting the most vulnerable among us, we appeal today: Take to heart the words of the bishops and the Holy Father, and do not exclude unborn children from the vulnerable people you want to protect! As priests committed to a consistent ethic of life, we applaud every effort to advance human dignity. But we likewise oppose the attempt of some in public office to soften the contradiction between being Catholic and being "pro-choice" on abortion. Tolerance of abortion not only contradicts the Catholic Faith; it also contradicts the American way, which is one of equality for every human being, and likewise contradicts human decency, which stands against all forms of violence. There is simply no excuse for a public official to fail to call for the protection of the lives of the youngest infants.

If you haven't visited the Knights of Columbus Web site in a while, I encourage you to do so the next time you're online. We've added many new features to www.kofc.org, but there are two that I wish to make you especially aware of.

The first is our member testimonial area, titled "Stages of Life." In this multi-media area, six "real-life" stories are told – stories of people at different stages of their lives. Relics of Priest Martyrs to Begin Pilgrimage of U.S. Cities

The relics of six Knights of Columbus canonized by Pope John Paul II in 2000 are beginning a tour of the United States on March 18 at the Cathedral Shrine of the Virgin of Guadalupe in Dallas. The six priests – Pedro de Jesus Maldonado Lucero, Miguel de la Mora de la Mora, Jose Maria Robles Hurtado, Luis Batiz Sainz, Rodrigo Aguilar Alemán, and Mateo Correa Magallanes – were martyred for their faith by the Mexican government during the religious persecution in Mexico in the 1920s.

Parish Priest — Father Michael McGivney and American Catholicism, a new biography on the Order’s founder, is now available online. Written by best-selling author Douglas Brinkley and Julie M. Fenster, the book is a fascinating account of Father McGivney’s world and the people who influenced him and came to know his greatness.
