CHAPLAIN'S COUNSEL

As you read this, it will be early July and summer is upon us. July is the month of St. Benedict whose feast day is celebrated on July 11th. St. Benedict, born in Nursia, Italy about 480 AD became first a hermit, living for some years in a cave high in the mountains of Italy near Subiaco where he later founded numerous monasteries.

He later moved and founded a monastery at Monte Cassino where he remained as abbot until he died around 543. It was during those years at Monte Cassino that St. Benedict wrote his famous Rule governing the administration and life of a monastery.

That Rule is still operating today, 1500 years later, in Benedictine monasteries around the world as well as in other religious orders. Indeed Benedict's Rule became the foundation of Western monasticism and was an enormous influence upon the entire Christian world and influences much of what we see and do as Christians today.

Our present Pope chose the name Benedict because of his profound admiration for St. Benedict and the Benedictine tradition.

Our history is filled with men and women of heroic virtue such as

PRO-LIFE ACTIVITIES

The Eucharist and Victory Over Abortion

Devotion to the Eucharist is never isolated from the rest of life. Rather, its purpose is to unite us to Christ, and this union means that we live in His life all the hours of our day. There are particular links between Eucharistic devotion and the fight to end abortion. Abortion is, according to the bishops, "the fundamental human rights issue" (NCCB, "Resolution on Abortion," 1989). Abortion destroys the most defenseless members of society, the babies in the womb. How does the Eucharist help us to be pro-life?

God Loves Small Things

The Eucharist teaches us that the importance of something cannot be judged by its size or appearance. Christ, the Son of God, takes on the appearance of a small piece of bread and cup of wine. Our Faith leads us beyond the appearances. We know that after the consecration there is no more bread or wine on the altar. Now it is Christ who is present, in His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. The Host is a Divine life and also a human life, because Christ is a Divine Person with both a divine and human nature. Yet the Host certainly does not look or act like the Son of God. Nevertheless, we worship the Host and cry out in our hearts, "My Lord and my God!"

If we can see Christ in the Host, then we can also begin to see Him in the poor, the weak, the terminally ill, and the repulsive and ugly person. We can also see Him in the baby in the womb. This child is hidden be-

hind the "veil" of the womb, much as Christ is hidden behind the "veil" of the Eucharist. Yet Faith takes us beyond appearances, and we can say of the preborn child, "There is a person like me! There is my brother, my sister, for whom Christ died!" Even when this child is a single cell resulting from fertilization, we are not deceived by appearances. He or she is one of us, equal in dignity.

The Victory of Life

The Eucharist is the victory of life. Christ gave us His Body and Blood as a memorial of His Passion and death. In other words, Christ says to us in the Eucharist, "Never forget that I died for you and rose again. Death is conquered and life is victorious. Come to me and share in this life!" If death is conquered, then abortion is conquered. It is up to us to spread this victory of life throughout our world. We do so by living out the Eucharist, namely, by giving our own lives that others may live. We, too, say "This is my body, this is my blood." We give our time, talent, effort, and painful sacrifice so that our brothers and sisters in the womb may be saved.

Practical Suggestions

Because there is a deep link between Eucharistic devotion and pro-life work, we should let that link be seen and heard. Some ways include the following:

1. Hold special pro-life holy hours and Masses. (Priests for Life offers a booklet of devotions for pro-life holy hours.)
2. In the prayers at holy hours and Masses, offer a petition for an end to abortion.
3. Request announced and unan-

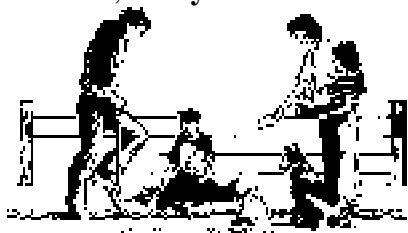
little by little the bond and love that I have for the Council just took off!

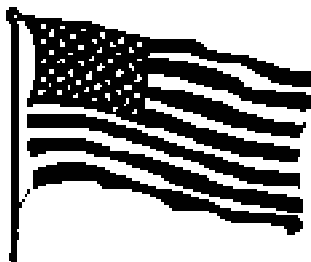

BIO OF GRAND KNIGHT, ANDREW (ANDY) GLEESON

I am a fourth generation Knight. I was born in Washington D.C. and am the middle child of five children. I am a proud graduate of St. John’s College High School in Washington D.C. The Christian Brothers, who conducted the school, indelibly touched my life. Their personal sacrifice towards the education of young men continues to inspire me to serve others. I have a Bachelor of Science degree from Towson University, which is how I landed in Baltimore.

I am married to the most beautiful person I have ever met, my wife Julie. We have been blessed three times so far with two boys and a girl, Tommy (4), Katie (3) and Paddy (1). My children are the reason that I became active in the Father O’Neill Council; this will be addressed further into the bio. My wife is one of seven children and we are the proud Uncle and Aunt to twenty-three soon to be twenty-five nieces and nephews!

I have been in the grocery business for the past twenty-two years. In high school I started as a bag boy for Giant Food and worked my way through college, serving in various other positions. Upon graduation, I went into the management program at Giant and left just short of fifteen years with the company. 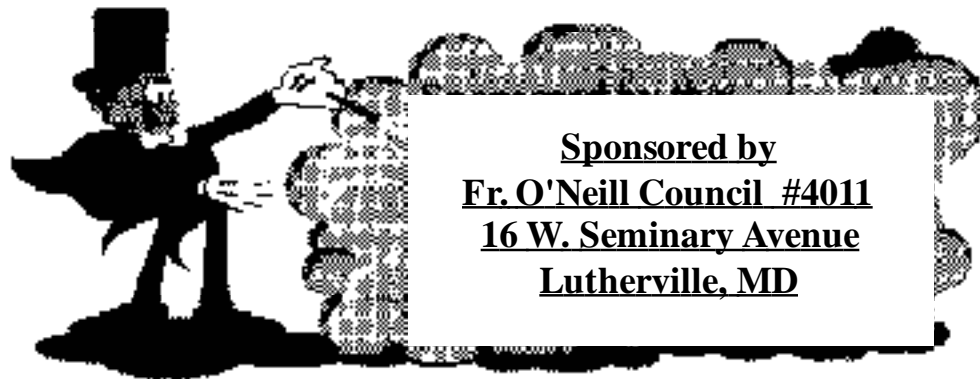

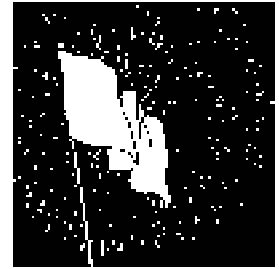
