A Great Week

(Taken from Fr. Pavone's Blog for the week of July 17th.)

I want to thank so many of you for joining me via television, radio, and internet this past week when I preached each day at the EWTN Mass and was Fr. Pacwa's guest (along with Janet Morana) on the EWTN Live show Wednesday night. It was a great week, not only because of the numbers of people we reached through the live broadcasts, but also because of the new set of Defending Life shows that we taped.

We will shortly have the audio link to my homilies available at www.priestsforlife.org/audio.

One of the themes that came up this week, thanks to the presence of Chris and Joan (Andrews) Bell, was the rescue movement. As many of you will know, Joan Andrews spent a year and a half in solitary confinement for peaceful, moral activity by which she intervened to save children from abortion. We had her husband Chris on the series to talk about the Good Counsel maternity homes. They were here with their seven children, six of whom are adopted. Their daughter Mary asked a question on the Live Show about when rescue activities will start again. I answered that they are actually starting again now. Young people (and some not-so-young) have been ready for a long time to resume this morally legitimate, peaceful activity – whose logic is inescapable once you acknowledge the unborn as persons – of blockading abortion clinic doors.

Emiliano, one of their adopted boys, approached me after the Live Show and reminded me of his life's story. After he was born, he was thrown in a garbage can and was found there by the police.

During the show, we also had a call from Guadalupe Lovera and her mom Helene. In 1994, Helene was in an abortion mill waiting room and saw me and others praying outside. She thought, "There's a priest outside. Why am I in here? I'm about to commit a mortal sin." And she changed her mind and came outside. I baptized her baby some months later – a baby named Guadalupe. Now, at age 11, she knows her story, and called in to thank all the pro-life people who pray and sidewalk counsel across the nation. She told us that using her personal story, she recently talked a woman out of an abortion, and the baby is now safely born.

I made a call for all survivors of scheduled abortions to contact me. It's time to form an association of those rescued from abortion.

It was a powerful week. I'm grateful to EWTN – and to all of you — for helping us save so many lives.

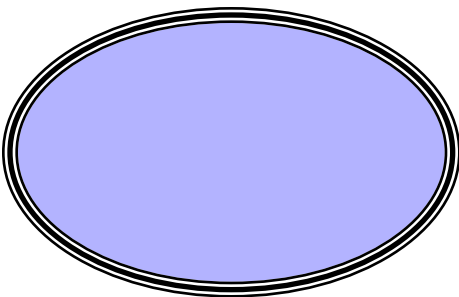

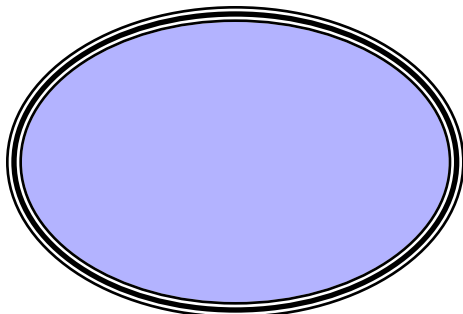

SUPREME NEWS:

Knights of Columbus Supports Stem-Cell Education Effort in Missouri

The Knights of Columbus has donated \$200,000 to an effort to educate Missouri residents about the complexities of stem-cell research. In November, Missouri residents will be asked to vote on a ballot initiative that would amend Missouri's state constitution to promote embryonic stem-cell research.

Don't Allow Marriage to be 'Discarded on the Junk Heap of History'

The Knights of Columbus has asked the Maryland Court of Special Appeals to overturn a decision which held that a law defining marriage as the union of a man and a woman is irrational and thus a violation of the Maryland Constitution. View the amicus curiae (friend of the court) brief filed by the Knights of Columbus.

The Order's Potential Remains Untapped, Supreme Knight Tells State Deputies

In his State of the Order Address to the leaders of the Knights of Columbus, Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson said the Order has the resources to support international expansion. More importantly, he said, the Order has the mandate to do

so from its founder and from Pope John Paul II.

Our Worthy State Deputy Edgar D. Haynes stated, "As I mentioned in the July State Bulletin, the theme of our administration is "Living Our Faith". Our Logo includes the State of Maryland, the Knights of Columbus emblem and a Silver Rose. The state is shaded "Grand Knight's Purple" in honor of our Grand Knights who lead our councils throughout the state. The Silver Rose represents Life. The history of the Silver Rose goes back to 1960 when Columbian Squires carried a Silver Rose from Canada, through the United States and into Mexico. The Silver Rose arrived at the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico on December 12, Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe - Patroness for the Unborn. The "Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose Program" (as it is known today) continues annually with the "Running of the Rose" from Canada into Mexico. Each summer, Brother Knights and Squires carry a Silver Rose from

Canada into the United States to arrive at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey on December 12th. The Silver Rose symbolizes our commitment to restore respect for the Sanctity of Life - from conception to natural death."

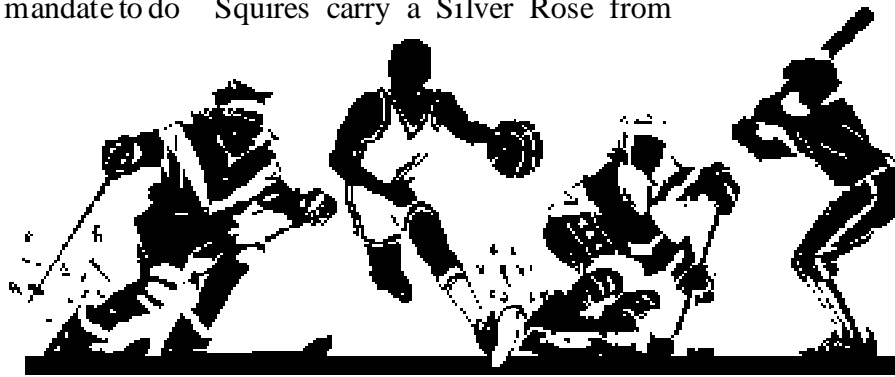
